Using reference to the available best evidence, regular meetings and consultation with partners



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Glossary

"specialisation" means an advanced understanding of a specific sector (hospital pharmacy)

"specialist practice" means specific competence in a defined field of practice (for example, oncology pharmacy or radiopharmacy).



Why a "sectorial" specialisation?

According to EAHP survey

52% of the EAHP members have a sectorial specialisation in hospital pharmacy covering

77% of the members population

In some European countries mandatory




Specialisation in Hospital Pharmacy

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The Specialist and Advanced Level Framework (SALF)

A competency-based approach is characterised by having a set **learned behaviours** which possess the following attributes:

- not dependent on job descriptions or functional task lists
- generalisable, and hence <u>transferable</u> across jobs and expected tasks
- educational and developmental in nature hence can be applied to practitioner development across sectors and scope of practice


PHARMACEUTICAL CARE COMPETENCIES

MEDICINES RELATED COMPETENCIES

PROFESSIONAL and MANAGEMENT COMPETENCIES

Basically identical to foundation level but expected at intermidiate level

Outcome specific competencies for Hospital Pharmacy (1)

PHARMACEUTICAL CARE COMPETENCIES

e.g.

- Patient consultation
- Providing information
- Selection of medicine

MEDICINES RELATED COMPETENCIES

e.g.

- Development and Production
- Monitoring medicine therapy
- Evaluation of outcomes



Outcome specific competencies for Hospital Pharmacy (2)

PROFESSIONAL and MANAGEMENT COMPETENCIES e.g.


- Organisation
- Effective Communication Skills
- Team work
- Service Provision
- Budget setting, medicine costs and reimbursement systems
- Staff Management
- Medicines Purchasing (Procurement)

- Rare diseases and emergency situation
- Hospital management
- Interface management
- Specialist practice
 - TDM/Pharmacokinetic
 - Oncology
 - Radiopharmacy

 - Paediatrics
- Development and research






